## Editorial Note:

### What Makes An Institution Work Tirelessly?

This is a question I've often asked myself—and one that many others have asked me too. Interestingly, most of us at the helm haven't paused to think about it deeply. We've simply done what we believed in: given our 100%, treated our work as a journey rather than a destination, and stayed true to the purpose.

"What makes one get up each morning with energy and enthusiasm?" is a similar question—and if I had to answer it in one line, I'd say: "it's the impact we see, every single day".

When we look back at the 21+ years of Unnati, we see a journey filled with purpose and quiet perseverance. Over 3 lakh youth have been empowered through our training and secured jobs under the Unnati Centre program. That's not a statistic—it's a story repeated a thousand times.

In the past three years, the abridged version of Unnati—UNXT, our finishing school model embedded in government colleges—has scaled rapidly. We've already reached over 2.5 lakh students through this initiative, alone.

These are not just numbers, for an organisation that operates offline, in-person, and believes in deep human connection. This kind of scale feels almost magical and perhaps what keeps us going.

### A Special Year, A Historic Milestone

This financial year is particularly special. We are attempting to train 2 lakh youth across 14 states—a scale rarely imagined, let alone achieved, in the offline, in-person training space.

With this Unnati will cross a historic milestone: "Half A Million" youth beneficiaries empowered through our programs. It's a number that's often spoken about, but seldom realized. For us, it's not just a figure—it's a reaffirmation of our belief that transformation happens one youth at a time, and that, consistent, committed efforts create scale with depth.

### Efficiency, Transparency, and Purpose

For the benefit of all our donors and patrons, I'd like to share something we're especially proud of: we are able to carry out this work at just ₹1,500 per beneficiary.

This has been made possible through strategic IT interventions. From training management to monitoring and reporting, our cloud-based systems have streamlined operations, reduced overheads, and enhanced our ability to scale—without compromising quality.

Our administrative costs remain below 5%, covering essentials like HR, finance, and a few support functions. Remarkably, our entire top management and many vertical heads serve as

volunteers. The commitment, ownership, and passion they bring to the mission is extraordinary—and a true reflection of the values that guide Unnati.

### **Your Role Matters**

As an organisation, we've grown significantly—we are now a team of over 500, and still expanding. With this growth comes the need for greater support, especially through CSR partnerships.

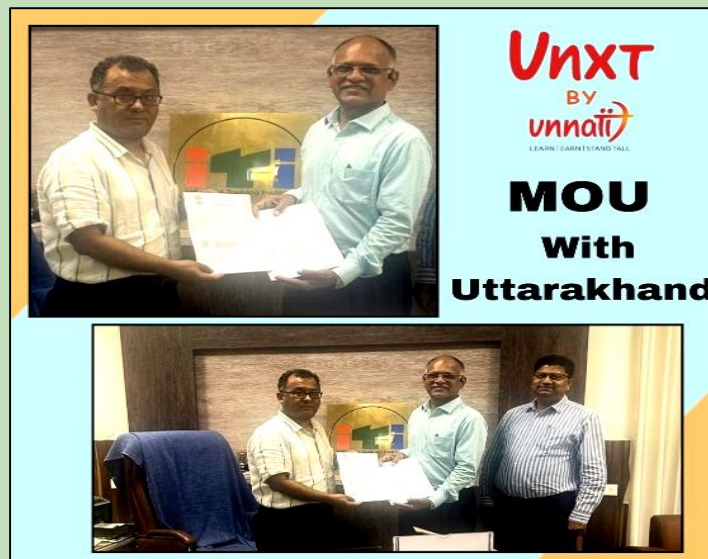

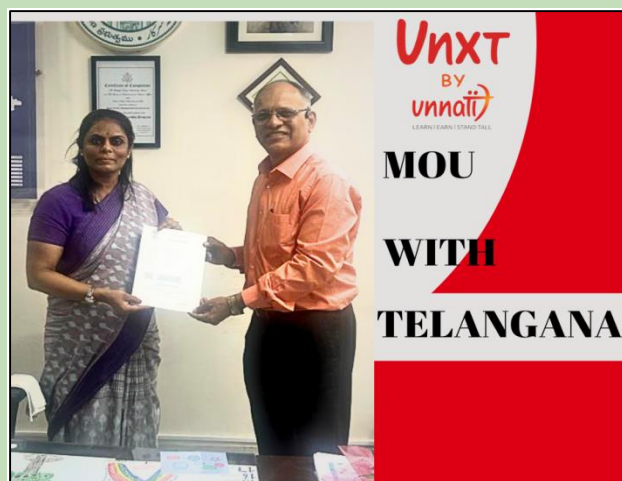
## **April 23<sup>rd</sup> 2025: Unnati Signs MOU with the Government of Uttarakhand!**

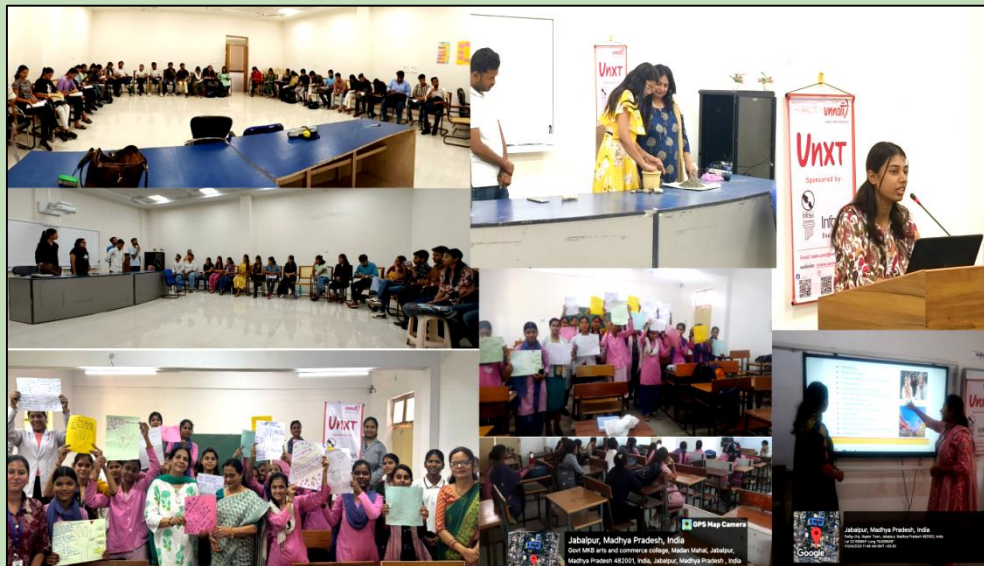
